

Joshua Gibson '94 Wins 2005 Williams Public Service Award

The Association sponsors an annual Public Service Award to recognize the public service accomplishments of a Williams alum currently living or working in the Washington area. This year's prize is the second to be awarded by the Association.

This year's winner is Josh Gibson '94, who will be honored during the Williams Fall Dinner to be held on October 25th (see p.1). Gibson won the award for his dedication to the DC community. He recently completed service as an Advisory Neighborhood Commissioner in Washington, and his proudest accomplishment was the reopening of a local low-income health clinic. In the lead-up to the closure of DC General Hospital, the clinic located in the Marie H. Reed Community Learning Center in Adams Morgan was also closed. Josh represented the community in the two years of task force meetings that followed. Finally, in September of 2003, the Community of Hope Clinic was approved to move into the vacant clinic space, and opened for business. In addition to the crucial daily services provided to their patients, the clinic played a key role in testing students for lead poisoning.

Josh has also served his community in a number of other ways, as co-founder the Adams Morgan Community Association, a neighborhood civic group, and as a member of the board of directors of the Patricia M. Sitar Center for the Arts, a neighborhood arts center serving children of all incomes.

Congratulations, Josh, and thank you for your service to the community.
